For Students Enrolled at IU Bloomington  
Spring Term 2012**

Throughout the 2011-2012 academic year, the Office of Teacher Education will be providing **FREE** tutoring and test preparation for students who will be taking the PRAXIS I for admission to the Teacher Education Program (TEP).

Check with your academic advisor before you schedule an appointment for Praxis I tutoring to verify whether or not your SAT or ACT or combined Praxis I scores meet the new testing requirement for TEP admission. See the TEP testing options listed below.

If you determine that you will need to complete the Praxis I test for admission, individual tutoring sessions for the Mathematics, Reading and Writing sections of the Praxis I test will be provided by Mike Daiga. Mr. Daiga will be available for individual tutoring sessions by appointment only. E-mail Mr. Daiga at [mdaiga@indiana.edu](mailto:mdaiga@indiana.edu) to schedule an appointment for individual tutoring.

- Tutoring appointments will be made on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Specify your problem area(s) on the test(s).
- Schedule your appointment(s) with the tutor at least 2-3 weeks prior to your test date.
- Plan on meeting with the tutor a minimum of 4 times before taking or retaking the test.
- Bring a recently completed practice test if you have one.
- If you are retaking one of the tests, bring a copy of your ETS score report with the results of that test(s) and raw points earned on each of the sub-tests.

**TEP ADMISSION TESTING REQUIREMENTS**

Students may satisfy the Academic Skills Assessment requirement for admission to the TEP by using any of the following options:

- Qualifying scores on the Praxis I
  - Reading 176; Writing 172; Math 175
- Praxis I combined scores of at least 527
  - Reading + Writing + Math scores = 527
- SAT composite score of at least 1100
  - MA + VE = 1100
- ACT composite score of at least 24
  - EN + MA + RE + SR scores divided by 4 = 24
- GRE score of at least 1100 based on Verbal + Quantitative (VA+QU=1100) For GRE test taken PRIOR to August 1, 2011
- GRE score of at least 301 based on Verbal + Quantitative (VA+QU=301) For GRE test taken AFTER August 1, 2011.
- A Master's Degree from a regionally accredited institution
