LICENSE ADDITION: READING (LEVEL I)

The State of Indiana has authorized Indiana University School of Education to offer License Additions in selected areas. This program is only available to teacher candidates who are in the process of completing an initial license in a recognized Teacher Education Program. A "C" or higher grade in each professional education course and a minimum 3.0 GPA in reading course work is required. The program has competitive enrollment.

In most cases it may not be possible to complete this license addition as part of the four year undergraduate degree program. A graduate option is available. Students should check with the Language Education Department to see when these courses are generally offered.
