Indiana University's nationally recognized Higher Education and Student Affairs (HESA) program is seeking applicants for a tenure-track assistant professor at Indiana University Purdue University, Indianapolis (IUPUI). The person in this position will collaborate with colleagues at both the Bloomington and Indianapolis campuses in teaching, advising, and conducting research and providing service in the area of higher education and student affairs.

We seek an early-career scholar who is demonstrating a strong record of faculty performance and is particularly interested in urban/metropolitan higher education issues, with a strong interest in the areas of community colleges, student development, and civic or community engagement within higher education. The successful candidate will want to draw on the nationally-recognized strengths of the HESA program and collaborate with colleagues at both campuses to look at education from a broad perspective.

Candidates should be making contributions to scholarship and service in the field, an interest in actively seeking external funding and have experience developing and teaching courses in higher education and student affairs. Also desired is experience advising masters and doctoral students, and assisting with program coordination.

IUPUI occupies a 300-acre campus adjacent to the downtown area serving over 30,000 students, including a significant number of minority and non-traditional students. Indianapolis is a thriving city of over one million people, with many cultural attractions and a very reasonable cost of living.

QUALIFICATIONS

Candidates should have completed a doctorate. Preference will be given to candidates with degrees in student affairs administration, higher education, or related fields. Candidates with previous administrative and teaching experience in student affairs administration and a focused inquiry agenda are encouraged to apply.

Application: Screening of applications will begin on September 30, 2011, and continue until the position is filled. Salary is commensurate with qualifications and experience. Indiana University offers an excellent benefits package. The appointment will begin in August 2012. Applications should include a letter of application, curriculum vita, three letters of reference with contact information, and a sample publication.
