Position in Special Education (Open Rank)

The Department of Curriculum and Instruction in the School of Education at Indiana University, the flagship campus of the Indiana University system and a major comprehensive research university, invites applications for an open rank faculty position in **Special Education**, to begin in August of 2012. The ideal applicant will be a nationally recognized researcher with a highly regarded grant writing and research program that focuses on issues relevant to Special Education. However, the Search Committee will also consider faculty with beginning research programs who demonstrate high promise.

The applicant will be expected to maintain a rigorous grant writing and research program and to teach doctoral, graduate and undergraduate classes. A doctorate in Special Education or a related discipline is required. Salary is commensurate with education and experience.

Qualifications: An earned doctorate in special education or a closely related field. Experience working with individuals with disabilities, successful college teaching experience, and the ability to work collaboratively with colleagues are essential. A history of successful grant writing and a national and international reputation also are important for appointment at the Associate and Full Professor Levels. At the Assistant Professor level, publication potential in special education is expected.

Application: Applicants should send: 1) a letter of application addressing qualifications and describing experiences and interests in teaching and research related to special education; 2) a current vita or resume; 3) three letters of reference that address the candidate's teaching, collegial, and research qualifications; and 4) contact information for up to three additional references who may be contacted during the search process.
