Armstrong Teacher Educator Award

The Armstrong Teacher Educator Program was created by a gift from Cook Group Companies to establish the Martha Lea and Bill Armstrong Fund in Teacher Education. This program is intended to increase involvement among teachers, Indiana University School of Education faculty, and pre-service education students. One aspect of the program allows IUB to identify a small, select group of school teachers each year from across the state of Indiana who will work with faculty and students in our undergraduate teacher education program. This year's awardees, who come from all parts of the state, have been identified by their colleagues and administrators as being truly outstanding.

Associate Instructor Outstanding Teaching Awards
