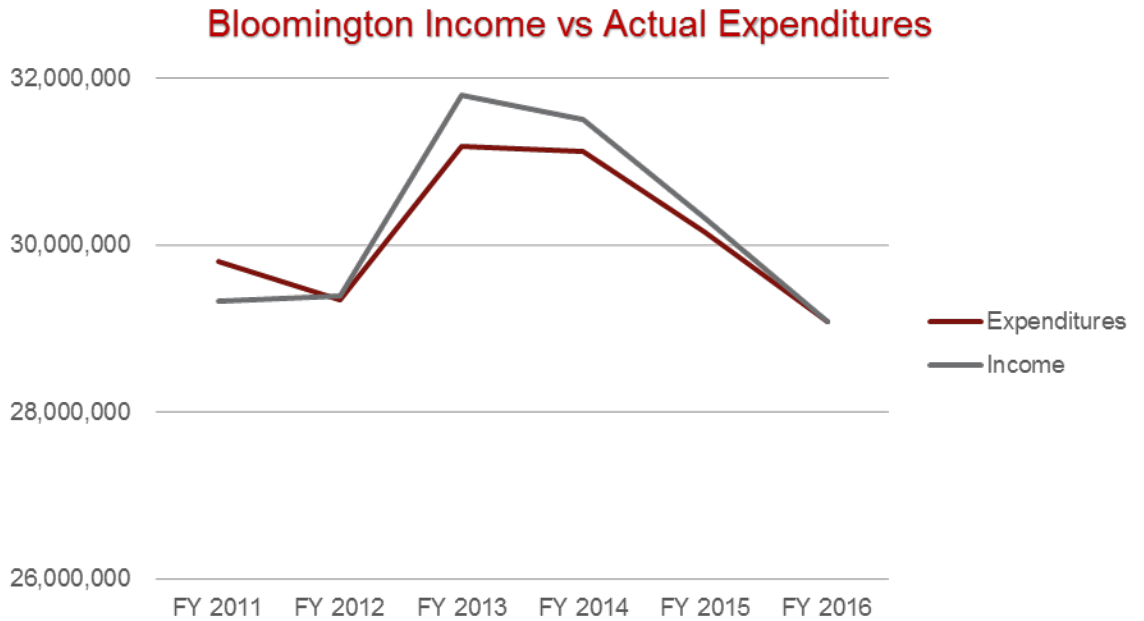

Income vs Actual Expenditures

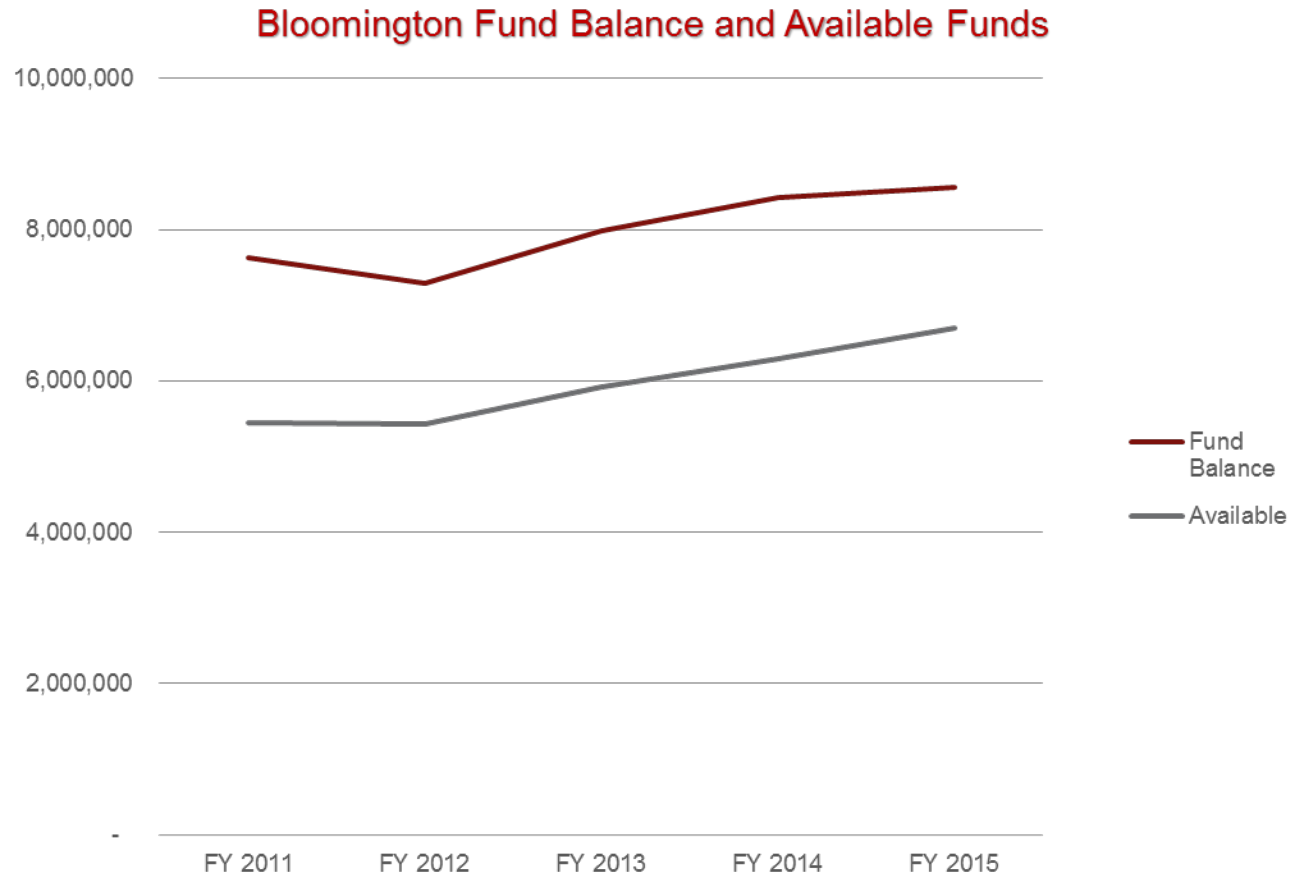

Progression of Fund Balances

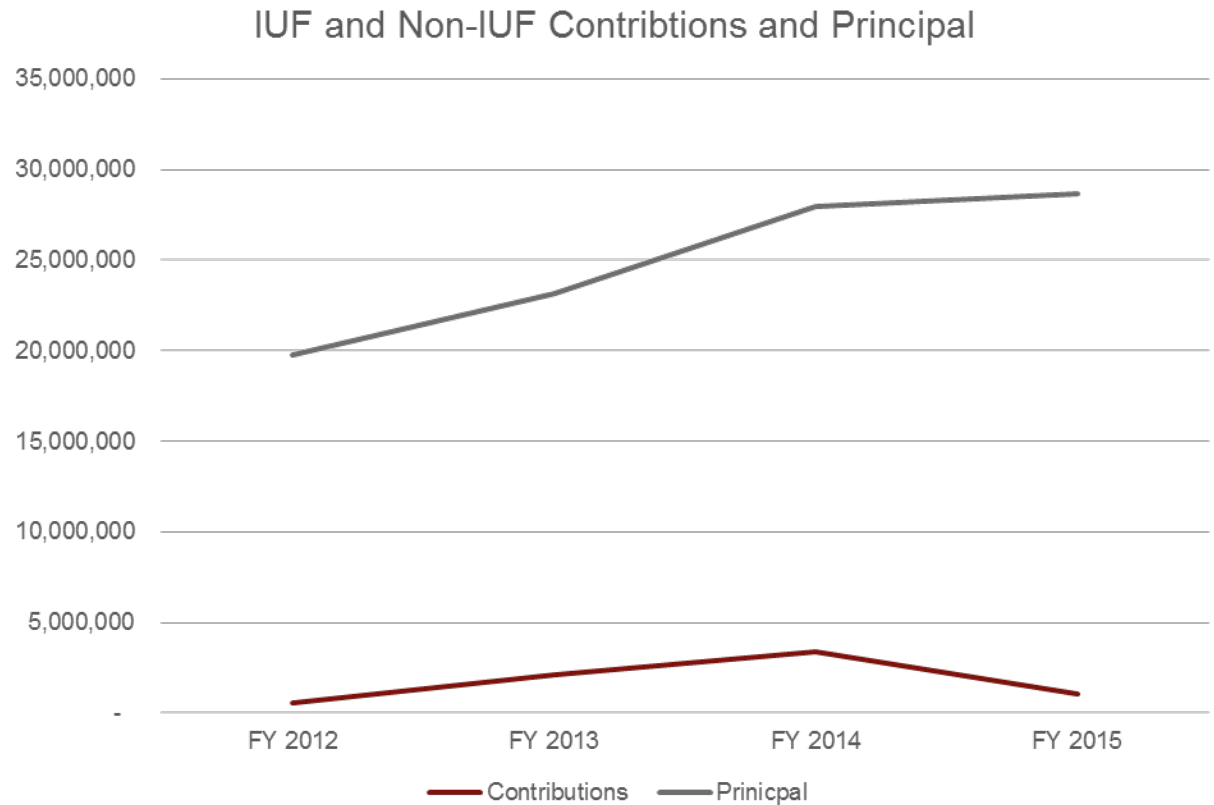

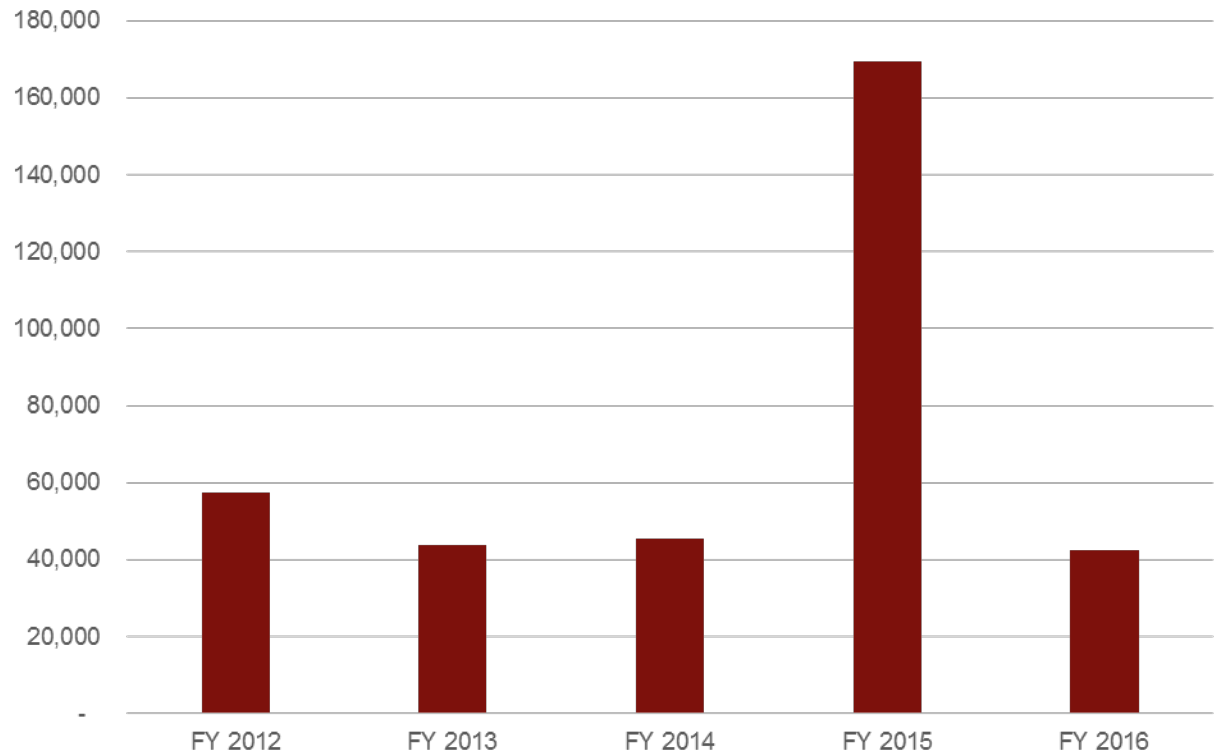

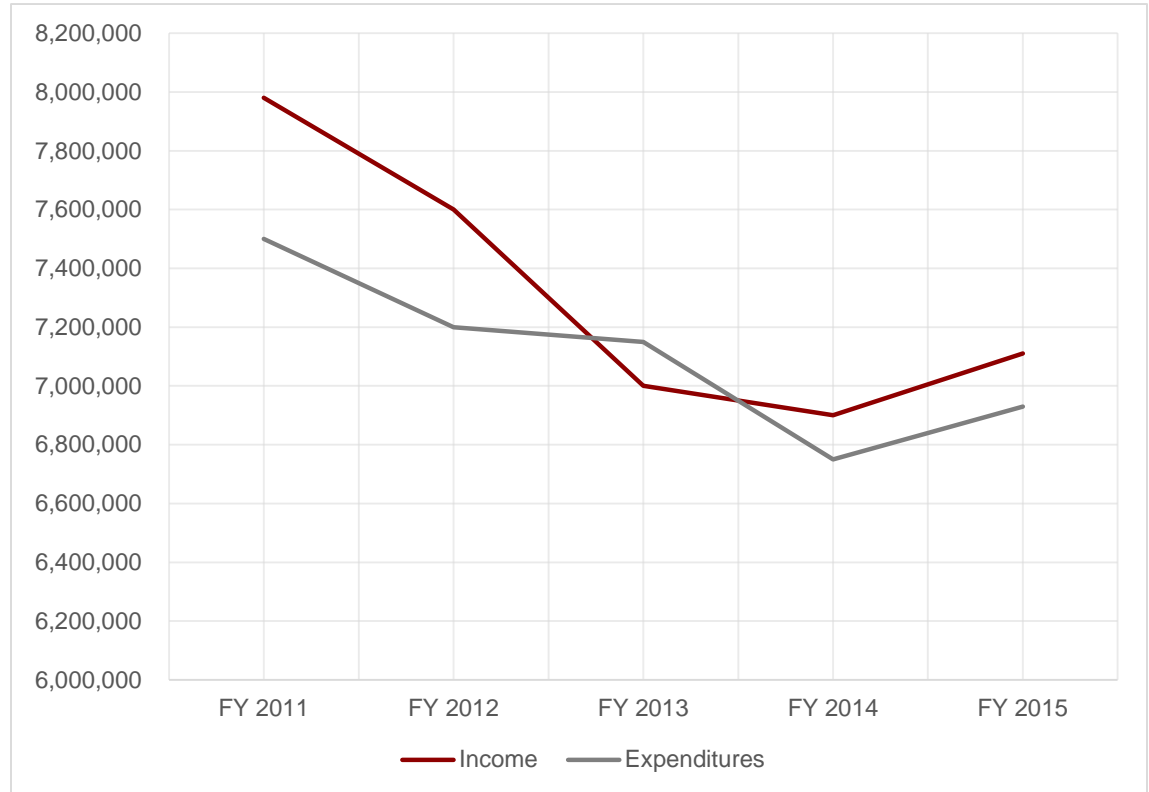
Financial Report - Indianapolis

IUPUI Income vs. Expenditures

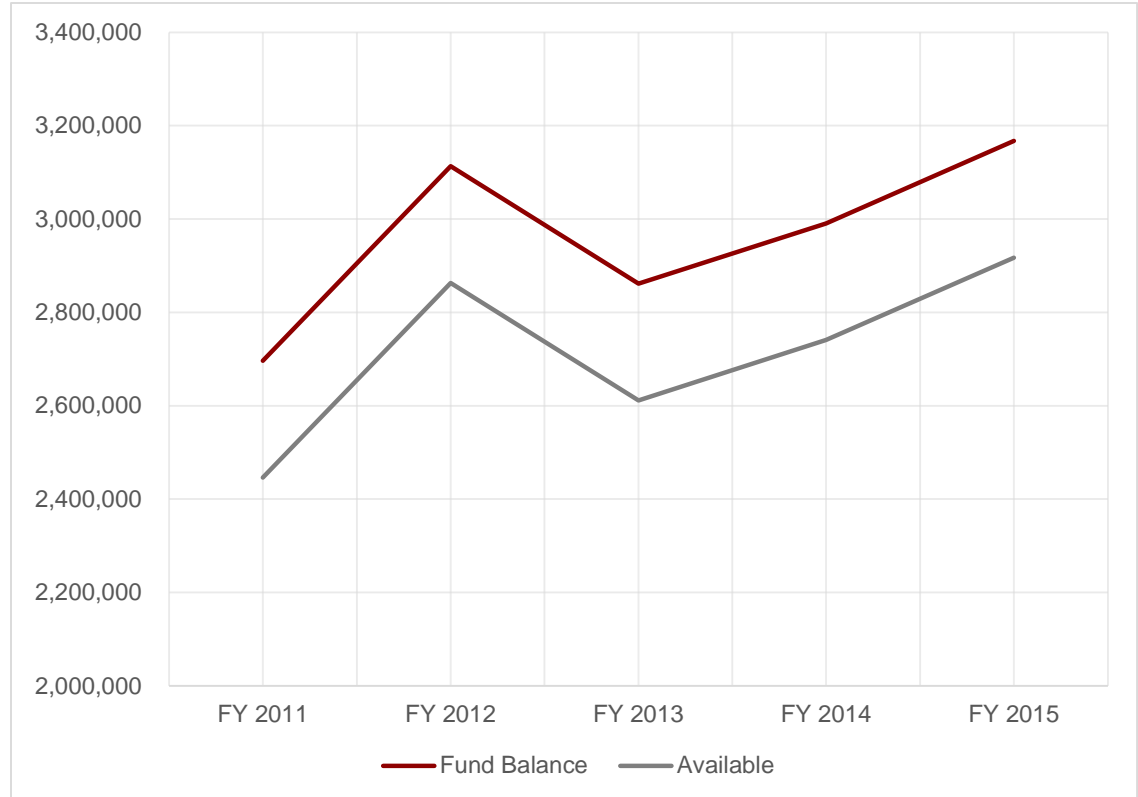

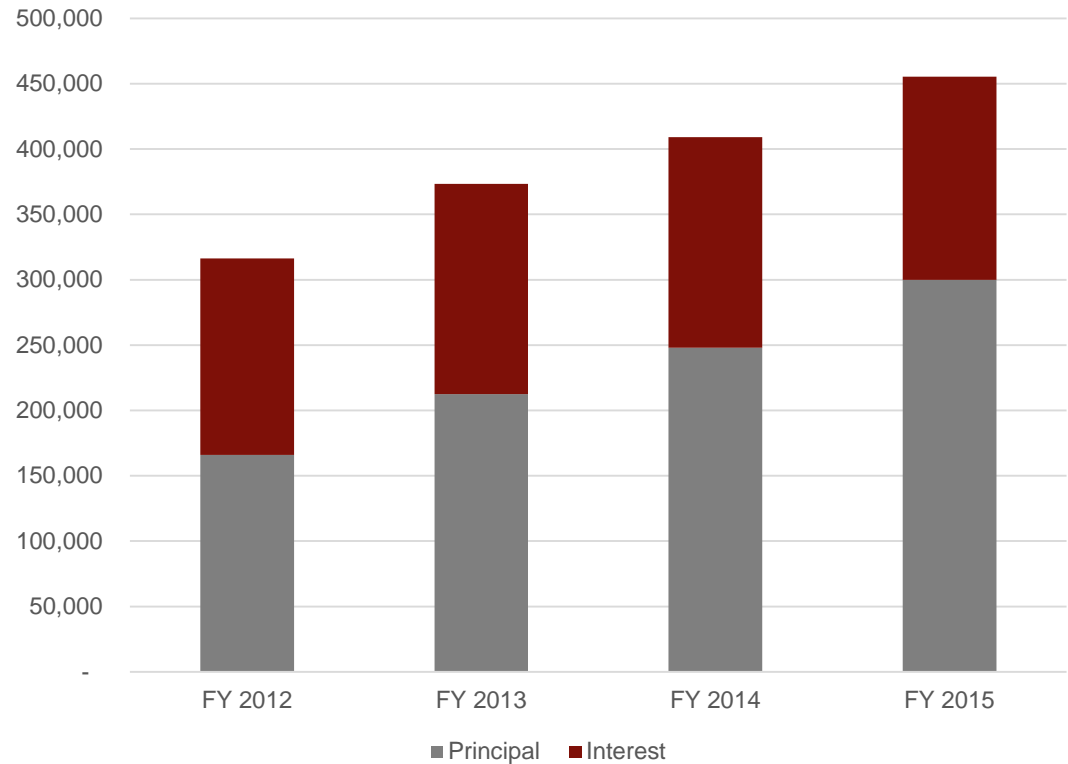

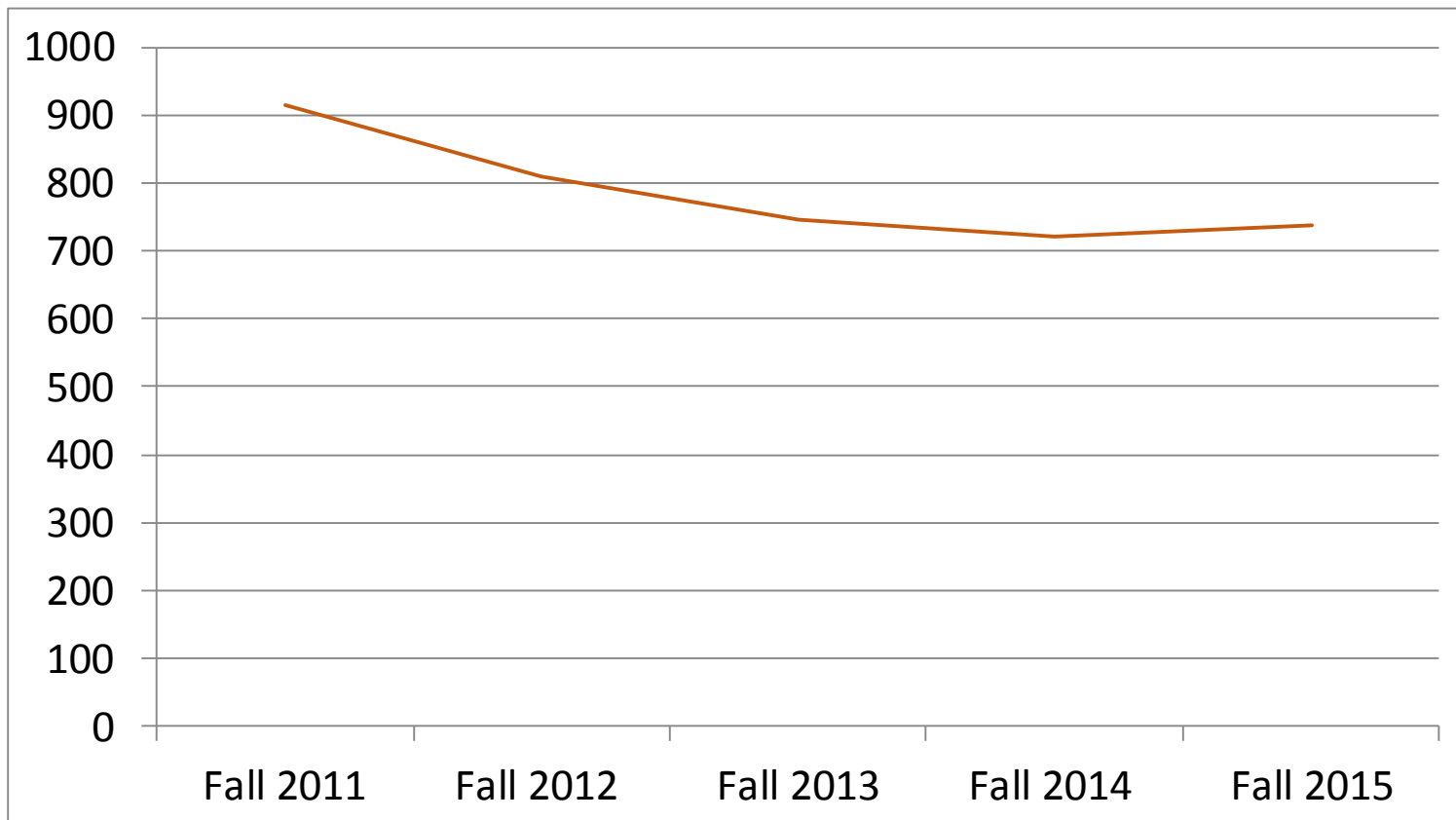

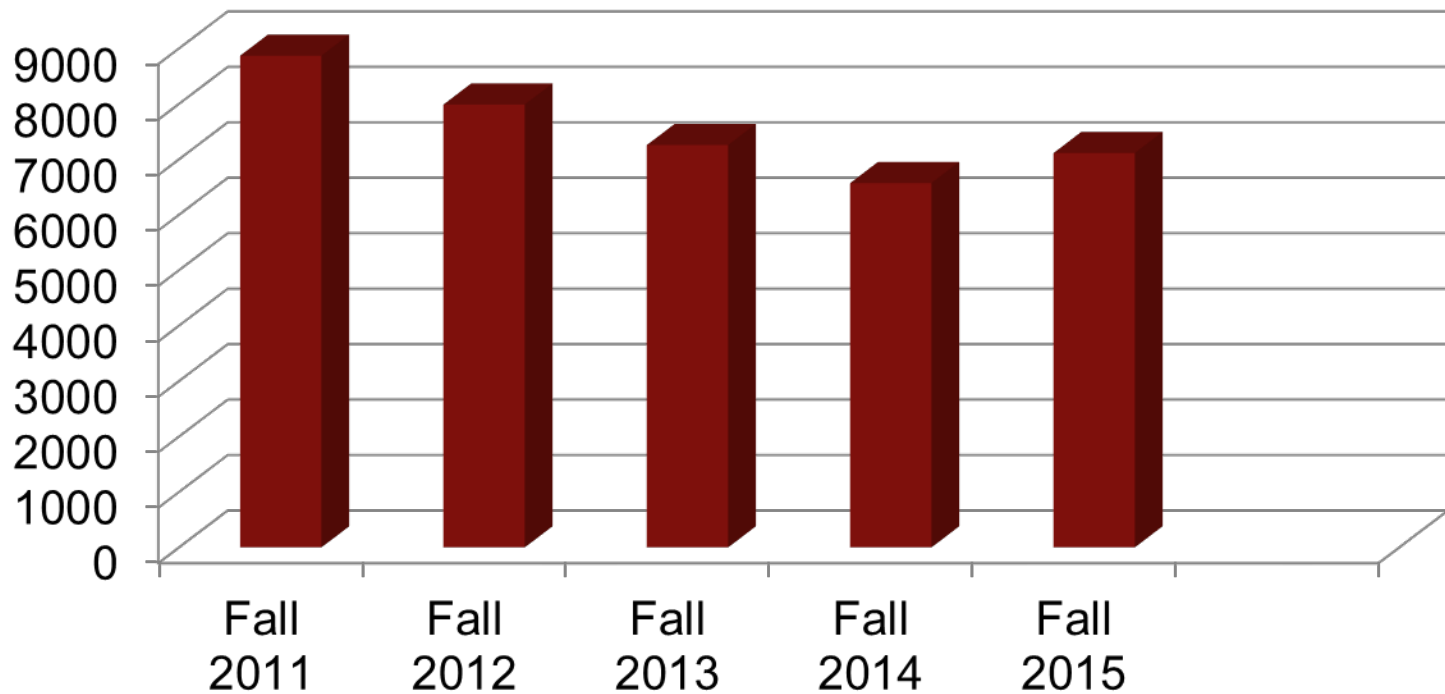
IUPUI Undergraduate Fall Enrollment

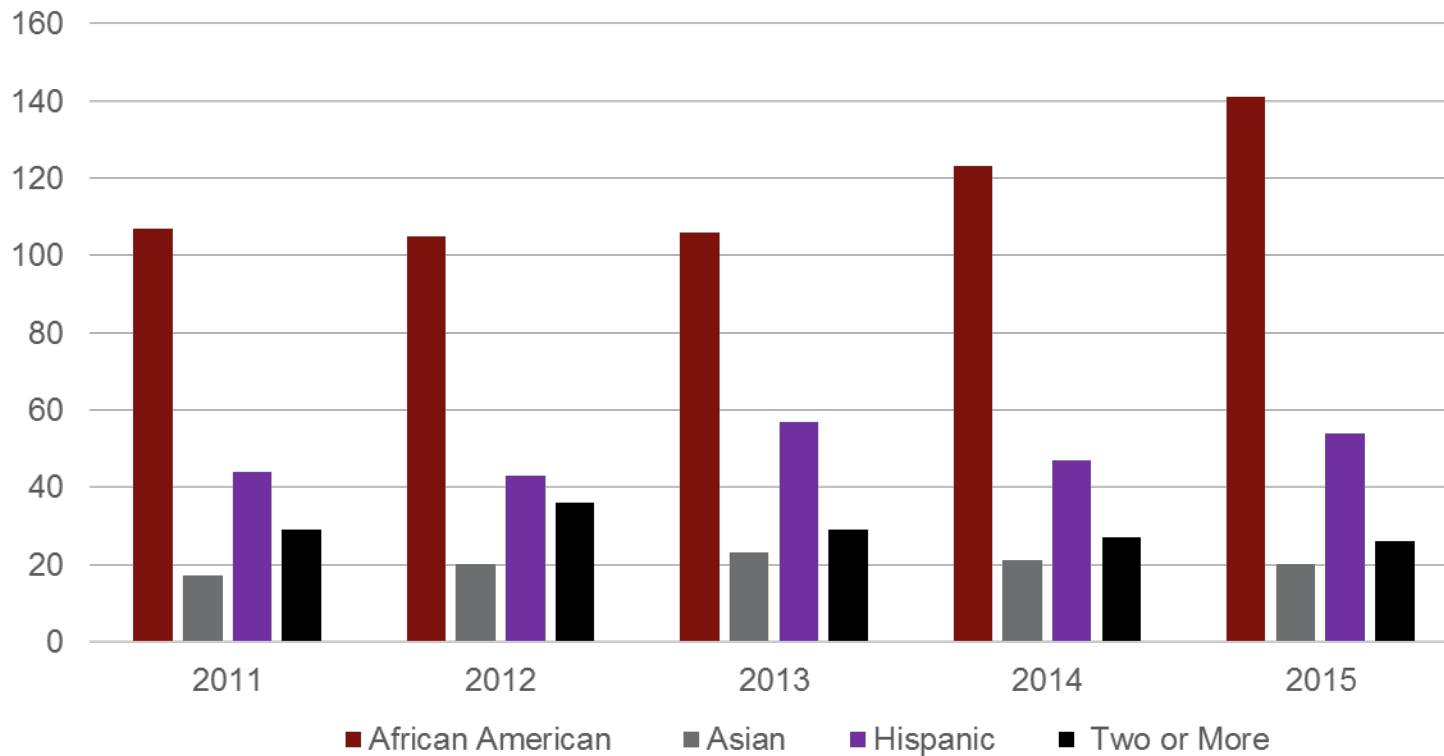

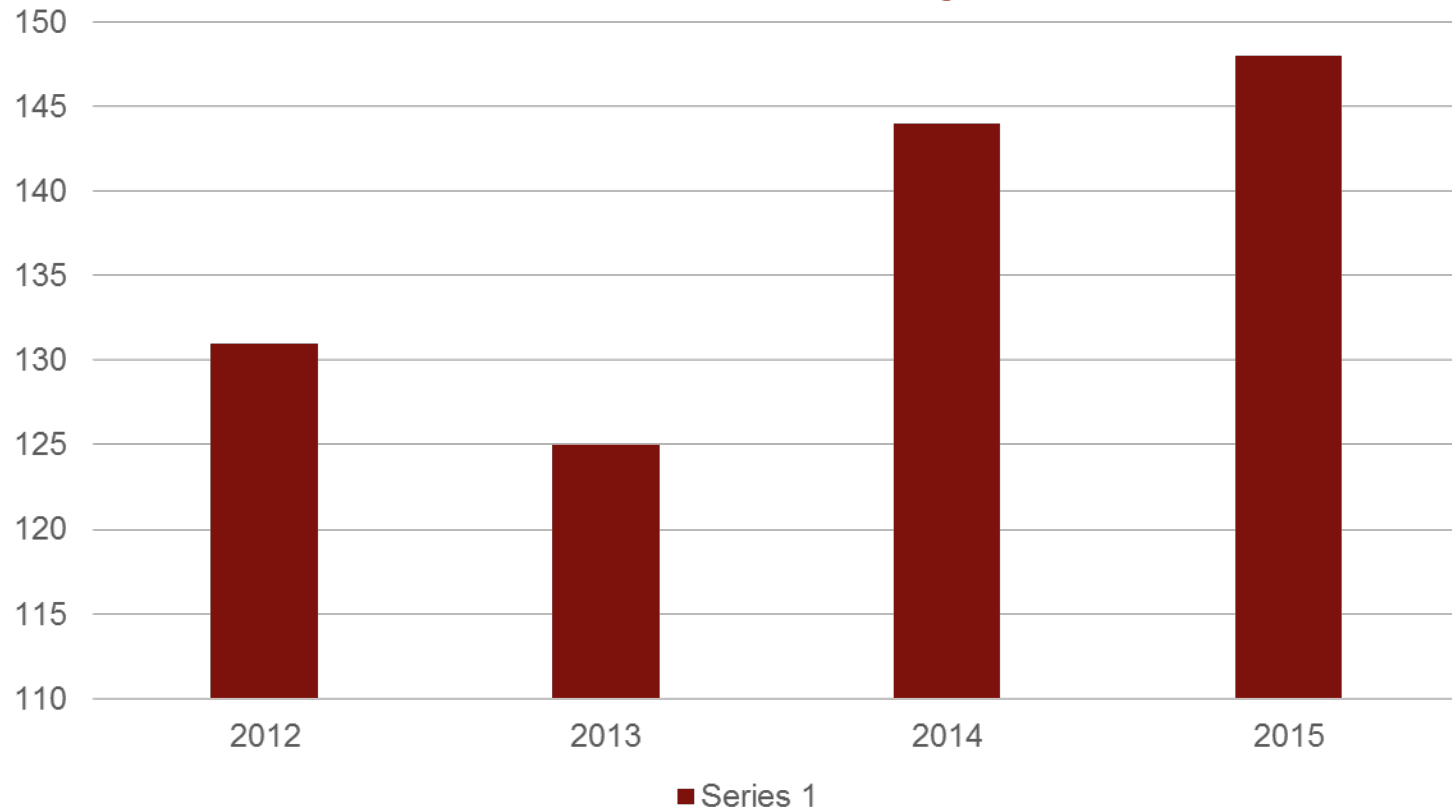

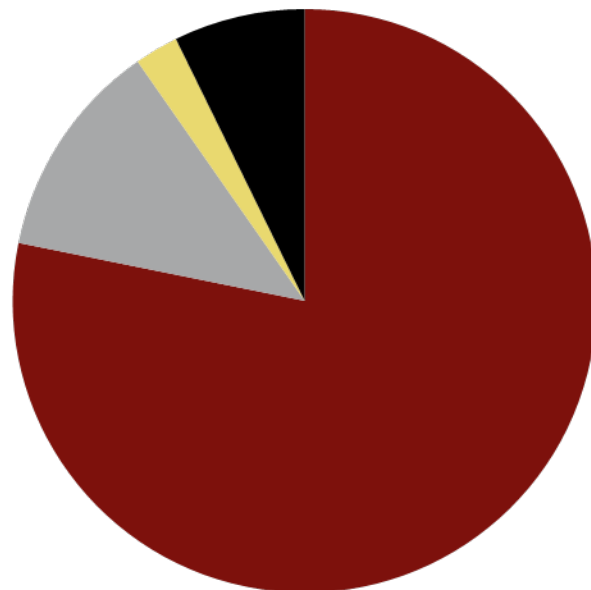

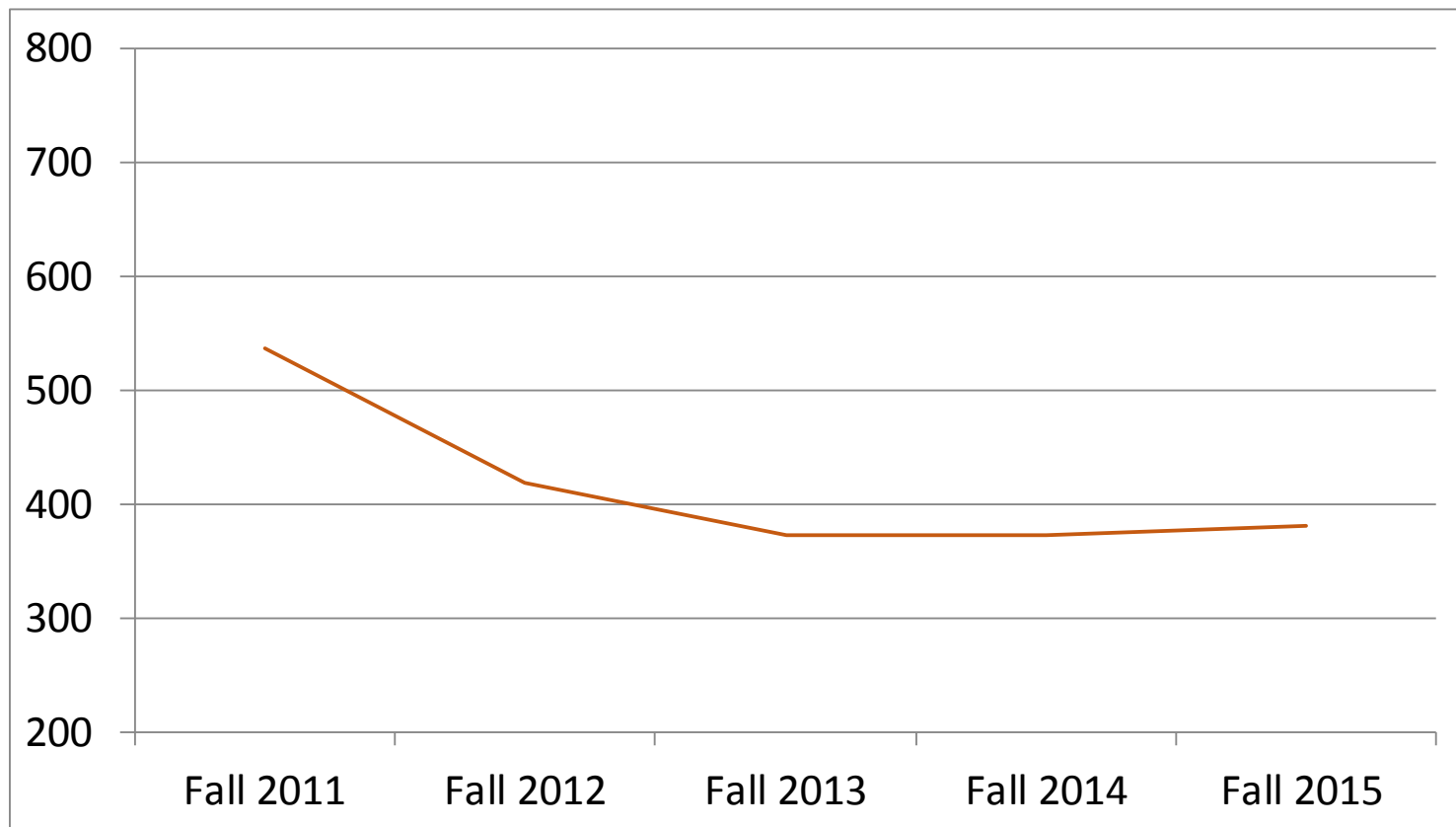
