Dr. Noddings is currently the Lee L. Jacks Professor of Child Education, Emerita, at Stanford University. She spent 28 years serving as a teacher and administrator in the New Jersey public schools. After earning her Ph.D. in 1975, she has served on the faculties at the Pennsylvania State University, Columbia, Colgate, the University of Chicago, and Stanford. She is a past president of the National Academy of Education, the Philosophy of Education Society, and the John Dewey Society. At Stanford, she received the Award for Teaching Excellence three times. Her



work has centered on the role of caring as an educational goal and as part of the educational process.

She has made substantial contributions to the ways in which educators think about the practice of caring and its connection to nurturing healthy and happy students.
