GRADUATE INITIAL LICENSE IN SECONDARY SPECIAL EDUCATION: EXCEPTIONAL NEEDS – MILD INTERVENTION (EMERGENCY PERMIT)

The graduate-level initial license in Secondary Special Education (Exceptional Needs – Mild Intervention) is earned through the Community of Teachers (CoT) program, an innovative, student-centered approach to teacher education. CoT students work closely with a faculty facilitator, a cohort of students across content fields and at different stages in their education, and a teacher mentor of their choice. This program sheet is for individuals who currently possess an emergency permit in Exceptional Needs – Mild Intervention only (i.e., not licensed in any other content/subject area) and are currently employed as a special education teacher.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- 1. ONE of the following:
- Baccalaureate degree from an accredited postsecondary educational institution with a grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 point scale; OR
- Graduate degree from an accredited postsecondary educational institution
2. Completed online application that includes:
- Transcripts
- Two letters of recommendation
- Resume
3. Invitation to join the Community of Teachers program based on an interview. To request an interview, contact curric@indiana.edu.

Note: The Three Pillars of the CoT program include Seminar, Portfolio, and Field Experience. Candidates should review the Three Pillars by reading the Mentor Handbook, Portfolio Handbook, and Policy Handbook, available on the Graduate Special Education CoT webpage.

Note: A master's degree in special education can be obtained with an additional 9 credits. Individuals who wish to obtain a master's degree must apply separately to the master's degree program. The maximum number of credits that can be earned as a non-degree student and still be used toward a master's degree is 15 credits. Students should apply for the master's degree before earning more than 15 credits in order to use initial licensure credits toward a master's degree.

LICENSE INFORMATION

Testing Requirements

Individuals pursuing licensure after September 1, 2021 will take Praxis licensure exams through ETS. Individuals planning to take licensure exams after this date may contact the Licensing Advisor (license@indiana.edu) for more information.

Portfolio Requirements

Students must complete 16 portfolio expectations under the mentorship of a licensed special education teacher.

• Suicide Prevention Training

PROGRAM COURSEWORK

34 credits/3.0 GPA

A grade of B or higher is required in each course.
