The Exceptional Needs – Mild Intervention license is added at the same grade levels listed on the individual's current practitioner license. This program prepares currently licensed teachers to educate students with mild/high-incidence disabilities in various educational settings.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Bachelor's degree from an accredited institution.
- 2. Minimum undergraduate GPA of 2.75 out of 4.00
- 3. Current practitioner license at the elementary (K-6), secondary (5-12), or preschool through grade 12 (P-12) level.
- 4. Completed online application that includes:
 - Transcript(s)
 - Personal Statement
 - Two Letters of Recommendation
 - Copy of Practitioner License

Note: A master's degree in special education can be obtained with an additional 7–16 credits (depending upon prerequisites and prior coursework). Individuals who wish to obtain a master's degree must apply separately to the master's degree program. The maximum number of credits that can be earned as a non-degree student and still be used toward a master's degree is 15 credits. Students should apply for the master's degree before earning more than 15 credits in order to use further license-addition credits toward a master's degree.

MENTORSHIP REQUIREMENTS

This license addition program requires students to identify a licensed special education teacher at their school to serve as their mentor for the duration of the program. If not currently employed by a school, students are required to identify a mentor in a local school.

LICENSE ADDITION INFORMATION

Testing Requirements

Individuals pursuing the Exceptional Needs – Mild Intervention license addition are required to pass two Indiana CORE assessments in order to add this area to an existing practitioner license:

- 1) Exceptional Needs Mild Intervention (Code: 025), AND
- 2) Exceptional Needs Mild Intervention: Reading Instruction (Code: 064).

Individuals are exempt from taking the Indiana CORE assessment in Exceptional Needs – Mild Intervention: Reading Instruction (Code: 064) if they meet <u>one</u> of the following conditions:

- Have a current practitioner license as an Elementary Generalist (P-6) and have passed the Indiana CORE assessment in Elementary Education Generalist – Subtest 1: Reading and English Language Arts (Code: 060), OR
- Have a current non-special education practitioner license and have passed the Indiana CORE assessment in Reading (Code: 038).

Portfolio Requirements

To obtain the license addition in Exceptional Needs – Mild Intervention, students must complete eight portfolio expectations under the mentorship of a licensed special education teacher. These include:

- 1) Teaching Reading and Writing
- 2) Individual Development
- 3) Instructional Strategies
- 4) Diverse Learners
- 5) Classroom Management and Community
- 6) Multicultural Understanding
- 7) Evaluating Students' Learning
- 8) Collaboration

PROGRAM COURSEWORK 21–30 credits/3.0 GPA A grade of B or higher is required in each course.

Literacy Requirement

EDUC-L 5XX

- Select one course from the following:
 EDUC-L 518: Reading Foundations/
 - EDUC-L 518: Reading Foundations/ Research for Literacy Learners (Fall)
 - EDUC-L 504: Identifying and Working with Learner's Literacy Difficulties (Spring)

Notes:

- The literacy course requirement may be waived for individuals who are licensed as an Elementary Generalist or who have passed the Indiana CORE assessment in Reading (Code: 038).
- The literacy course requirement can only be taken during the fall or spring semesters and is not included in the suggested sequence below.
