# TEACHER CERTIFICATION: WORLD LANGUAGE (JAPANESE)

This certification enables you to teach in All-School Settings (K-12). Course requirements for this program are valid at IUB as reflected in the School of Education Bulletin. The degree is granted by the College of Arts and Sciences when students complete the East Asian Languages and Cultures major with a track in Japanese offered by the School of Global and International Studies. A four-year college plan requires completion of 15 credits each semester. A 2.5 GPA overall is required for retention and graduation. A total of 120 credits is required for certification.
