## B.S. EDUCATION: LANGUAGE ARTS/ENGLISH

This Bachelor of Science in Education degree enables you to teach Middle School/Junior High or High School students. A 2.5 GPA overall is required for retention and graduation. A total of 120 credits are required for graduation.
