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This Bachelor of Science in Education degree enables you to teach specific content fields in the All-Grades (Grades P-12), Middle School/Junior High or High School (Grades 5-12) setting. A 2.5 GPA overall is required for retention and graduation. A total of 120 credits is required for graduation.
