- 1) No course below the 200 level will count toward completion of the major.
- 2) All students must arrange for and complete the departmental language proficiency exam prior to completing Block II: EDUC-M 445 Methods of Teaching Foreign Language. The examination may be taken more than once, but it must be passed before student teaching. See your Methods of Foreign Language instructor for additional information.

Choose one of the following options:

- 1) Complete:
 - HISP-S 250 Second-Year Spanish II (P: HISP-S 200) AND
 HISP-S 280 Spanish Grammar in Context (P: HISP-S 250)

- 2) If you test into HISP-S 280 and complete it with a C or better, you can claim special credit for HISP-S 200 and HISP-S 250.
- 3) If you test into an HISP-S 300-level and complete it with a C or better, you can claim special credit for HISP-S 200 and HISP-S 250. Students who place into an HISP-S 300-level course must replace HISP-S 280 credit with an additional HISP-S 300/400-level course. Special credit is not granted for HISP-S 280.
