

## B.S. EDUCATION: EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION: TEACHING ALL YOUNG LEARNERS CONCENTRATION (TAYL)

The Bachelor of Science in Early Childhood Education leads to a license to teach infant/toddler preschool programs and grades K-3 with an emphasis in child development, family-centered practices, and special education. Graduates are prepared to be P/K-3<sup>rd</sup> grade teachers in inclusive classrooms, to teach in preschool special education, for positions within agencies and organizations that serve young children and their families, and for working in Indiana's First Steps system in early intervention and developmental therapy. Course requirements for this program are valid at IUB as reflected in the School of Education Bulletin. A four-year college plan of **120 credits** requires completion of 15 credits each semester. The following are required for retention, student teaching and graduation: a 2.0 GPA in each content area; a 2.5 GPA in the Professional Education and overall; and a grade of C or higher in each professional education course.
