The Educational Studies minor is designed for undergraduates outside the School of Education interested in education as a field of study, i.e. as a social institution, public policy arena, or as a developmental process. Students seeking a minor in Educational Studies are required to complete a total of 15 credit hours of course work.

- NOTES:**
- Students must complete 15 credits for the minor.
 - All courses must be completed with a grade of C or higher.
 - Courses must average a minimum of 2.00 overall to earn the minor. (Note: For students who may consider pursuing a BS in Education and teacher certification based on completing specific coursework below, a minimum of 2.5 overall GPA is required for admission to the School of Education & Teacher Education Program.)
 - Minimum of 6 hours must be at the 300 or 400 level.*
 - Students interested in the Education Minor must meet with a School of Education Academic Advisor to identify a course plan.

*IMPORTANT NOTE FOR COLLEGE OF ARTS & SCIENCES STUDENTS:

In order for the Educational Studies Minor to appear on your transcript, at least 9 credit hours must be at the 300-400 level.
