International and Comparative Education Minor (Non-Teaching)

The International and Comparative Education minor is designed for undergraduates outside the School of Education interested in education. It provides students with the opportunity to study the broad issues involved in both the historical and contemporary debates around education from a global perspective, the cross-cultural sensibility and analytic skills required to conduct comparative inquiry about education systems, or the practical skills and opportunities to make a difference in a cross-cultural or international educational setting. Students seeking a minor in International and Comparative Education are required to complete a total of 15 credit hours of course work.

NOTES:

- Students must complete 15 credits for the minor.
- All courses must be completed with a grade of C+ or higher.
- Courses must average a minimum of 2.5 overall to earn the minor. (Note: For students who may consider pursuing a BS in Education and teacher certification based on completing specific coursework below, a minimum of 2.5 overall GPA is required for admission to the School of Education & Teacher Education Program.)
- Minimum of 9 credits must be at the 300 level or higher.
- Minimum of 9 and a maximum of 12 credits will be taken in the School of Education
- Minimum of 3 and maximum of 6 credits (for Regional Cultural Context of Education & Comparative Thematic Inquiry) will be taken in the College of Arts and Sciences, the School of Public Health, or the School of Public and Environmental Affairs.
- Students interested in the International and Comparative Education Minor must meet with a School of Education Academic Advisor to identify a course plan.
