International and Comparative Education Minor (Non-Teaching)

The International and Comparative Education minor is designed for undergraduates interested in education. It provides students with the opportunity to study the broad issues involved in both the historical and contemporary debates around education from a global perspective, the cross-cultural sensibility and analytic skills required to conduct comparative inquiry about education systems, and the practical skills and opportunities to make a difference in a cross-cultural or international educational setting. Students seeking a minor in International and Comparative Education are required to complete a total of 15 credit hours of course work.
