SCHOOL OF PUBLIC AND ENVIRONMENTAL AFFAIRS: EDUCATION POLICY MINOR (NON-TEACHING)

Students seeking to learn more about public policy related to education are encouraged to consider the 15 credit minor that combines education policy and foundations & SPEA management and finance.

NOTE:

- Students must complete 15 credits for the minor. At least 9 credits must be at the 300 or above level. A grade of C or higher is required in each course and a 2.0 GPA overall for the minor.
- Only one (1) education course may overlap between an education program and an academic minor.
- No course overlap is allowed between academic minors and/or certificates. (i.e., EDUC-H 340 cannot be used to fulfill a requirement in both the Education Policy Minor and International and Comparative Education minor.)
- Courses from other academic units on campus cannot be used to fulfill a requirement for both an education program and an academic minor (i.e., HIST-H 105 cannot be used to fulfill a social studies education program and academic minor in History requirement.)
 - Exception: Elementary Education Content (Language Arts, Fine Arts, Math, Science and Social Studies) and one of the designated academic minors may double count classes.
