## B.S. EDUCATION: ELEMENTARY SPECIAL EDUCATION (TEACHING ALL LEARNERS)

The Bachelor of Science in Special Education/Elementary leads to a teaching license for generalist and exceptional needs, mild intervention teaching in grades K-6. Course requirements for this program are valid at IUB as reflected in the School of Education Bulletin. A 4 year college plan of 130+ credits requires completion of 17-18 credits each semester. The following are required for retention, student teaching and graduation: a 2.0 GPA in each content area; a 2.5 GPA in the Professional Education and overall; and a grade of C or higher in each professional education course.

NOTE: Initiatives are underway to integrate a year-long student teaching opportunity into the program. Candidates will be able to complete the program in four years, if they successfully complete semesters of 17-18 credits. Candidates may complete the program in four years with additional summer coursework.
